## Treasury Notes

The age of extremely low interest rates looks likely to be with us for 2013, so it is even more important to make sure that your group is getting the best return available on any reserves it may have. Even in the times of higher interest rates, the then County Treasurer advised that any group or district executive committee maintaining more than a working balance with a high street bank or building society was not taking its trustee responsibilities seriously. To illustrate the point one group in Runnymede with cash assets of £4,000 earned £21; while another with cash assets of nearly £34,000 earned just over £2. The question is: where to look for a good but safe return and easy access? The District (and a number of groups) has deposit accounts with the Charities Official Investment Fund currently paying 0.75% per annum ([www.ccla.co.uk](http://www.ccla.co.uk)). The Scout Association has a Short Term Investment Service paying slightly less than COIF (no website detail, so call Frances at Scout HQ on 020 8433 7252 – Mon to Fri 9am to 3pm for details). The Charities Aid Foundation's CAF Bank has a range of accounts paying more than a high street bank or building society ([www.cafonline.org](http://www.cafonline.org)).

From 1 January 2013, HMRC has changed the wording of Gift Aid declarations. The primary changes mean that donors must now confirm that they will pay enough tax to cover all donations they intend to make that year - **excluding VAT and Council Tax**. The revised wording can be found on HMRC's website: [www.hmrc.gov.uk/charities/appendix\\_b1.pdf](http://www.hmrc.gov.uk/charities/appendix_b1.pdf) Forms based on the previous wording and signed before 31 December 2012 will be accepted by HMRC.

The District Executive Committee will be setting its budget and capitation for 2013-14 at its meeting on 21 January. We have been told that the HQ subscription will remain at £21 and that the County subscription has been increased by 15p to £5.40. The total capitation figure will be announced after the meeting.

## District Online Scout Shop

Thanks to our energetic DC, the online Scout Shop has generated sales of over £6,000 during 2012. We are pleased to announce that 50% of the gross profit will again be paid to each group, pro rata to the sales attributable to that group.

The prize for the highest dividend goes to 1<sup>st</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> Addlestone who will be receiving £123.97; close runners up are 1<sup>st</sup> Ottershaw with £121.76 and 1<sup>st</sup> Egham Hythe receiving £117.51. Our newest group, 1<sup>st</sup> Egham, came a creditable fourth with £98.67.

Some groups are not making the best of this facility and we would encourage everyone to promote it to parents and leaders. The more purchases generated the higher the dividend. The 50% of gross profit retained by the District was used to meet running expenses of the shop and to subsidise the current year's District capitation by about 50p per head.
